to be afforded for the re-establishment of industry.

Secretary Baker said it was clear there was work enough in the United States for all the labor in the country. Many government activities, like the shipbuilding industry, will understand that the war is long time; others will be gradually readjusted.

**NO SUDDEN TRANSITION.**  
Regardless of what policy the government adopts toward cancelling contracts later for war materials or withholding further orders, one of the principal of war will be to avoid any sudden transition which would close industrial plants and throw workmen out of employment. This assurance has been given by competent authorities of the government together with the explanation that the government probably will find it necessary to exercise large measures of regulation over private industry before peace is formally declared and during the reconstruction period thereafter.
