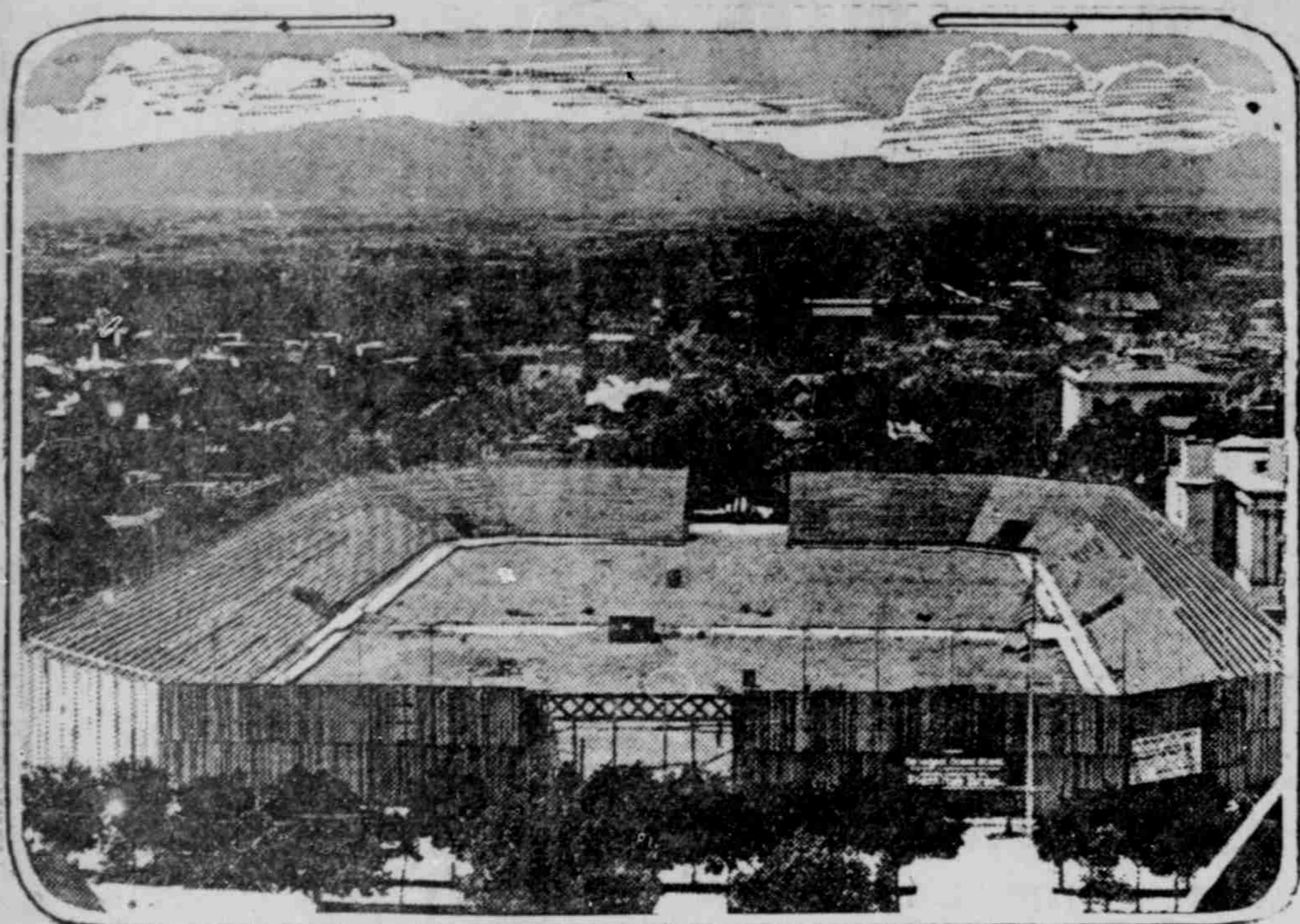


55,000 KNIGHTS TEMPLAR TO MARCH THROUGH BIGGEST TEMPORARY STADIUM EVER BUILT WHEN THEY MEET IN DENVER THIS AUGUST



The great \$30,000 stadium with the view of the Colorado Rockies the Knights Templar will get as they go through their maneuvers.

DENVER, Col., July 25.—The biggest temporary stadium ever built anywhere is ready in Denver for the Knights Templar conclave, which begins here Aug. 2.  
The enormous stand occupies the new civic center site. It is 710 feet long, 410 feet wide, and it will seat comfortably 30,000 people. It took four weeks to build, and as soon as the Knights Templar conclave is over a force of men is ready to begin razing it. And the cost of the stadium is \$30,000.

The stadium will be used for the drills, in which 3,000 knights will take part. It also will be used as a reviewing stand for the parade on Aug. 12, when 65,000 men are expected to march. The parade will take six hours to pass the stand.  
But the big stadium is only one feature provided by Denver for this great conclave. For electric effects on the streets and decorations \$150,000 is being spent.  
The Church of the Holy Sepulchre at Jerusalem is being reproduced in half-reduction, and the Micklegate

Bar of the Benedictine abbey, York, England, is being reproduced complete.  
A knight in armor, 50 feet high, against a Colorado sunset, towering 60 feet into the air, will be outlined in electric lights. The city streets, for 60 blocks, will be canopied with incandescent bulbs. No "world's fair" ever has had a lighting scheme to equal that planned for Denver. An electric cross 60 feet high will be suspended from a captive balloon 1,000 feet above the dome of the state capitol.

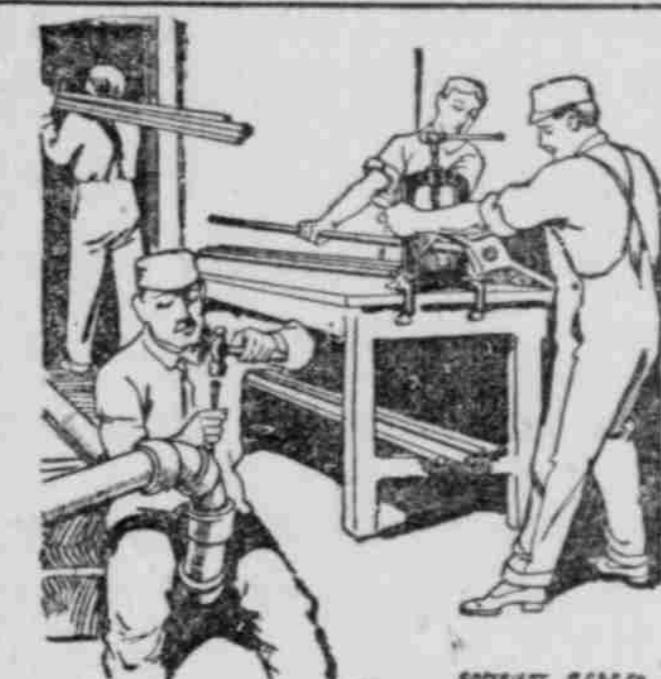

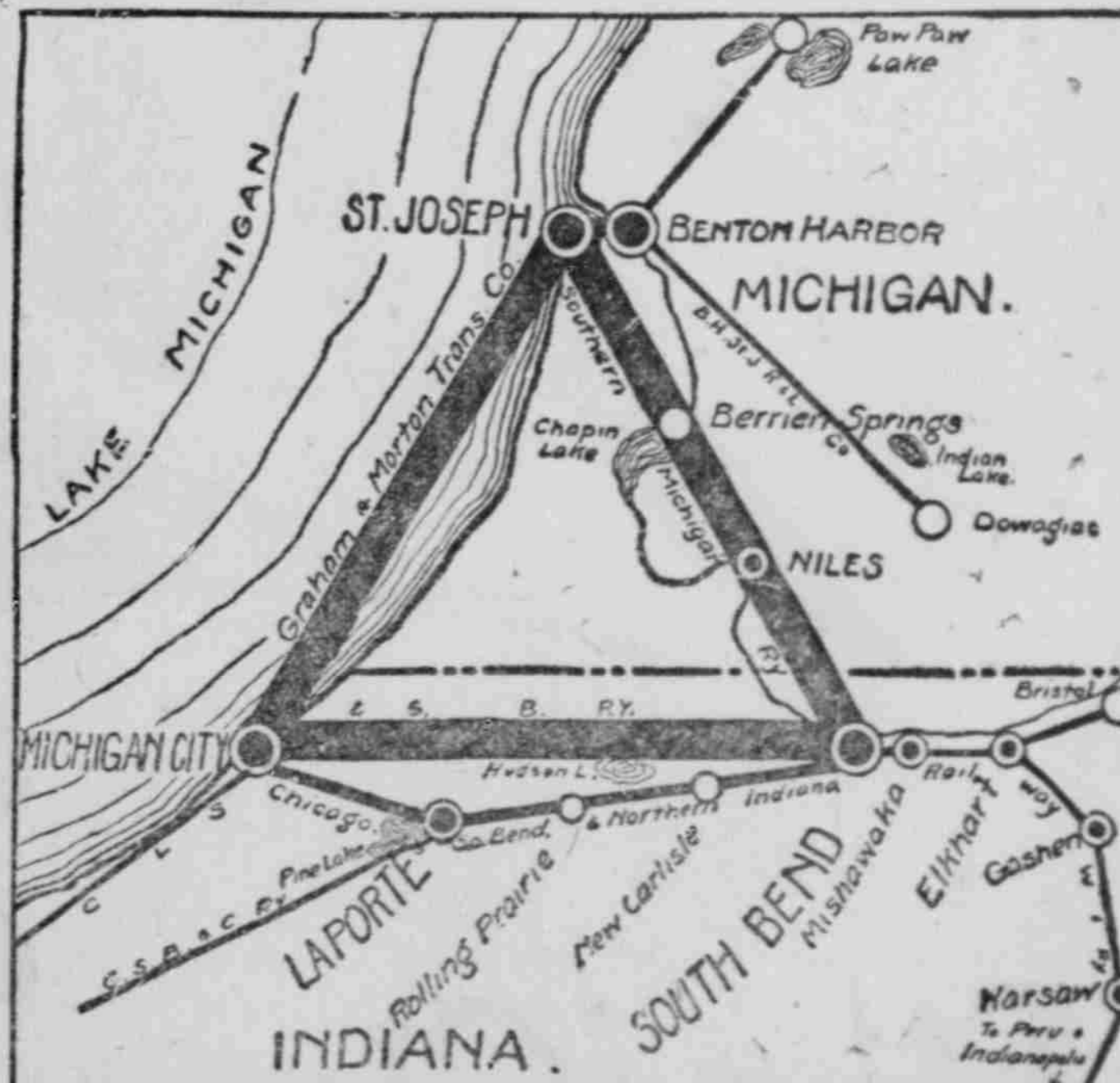
