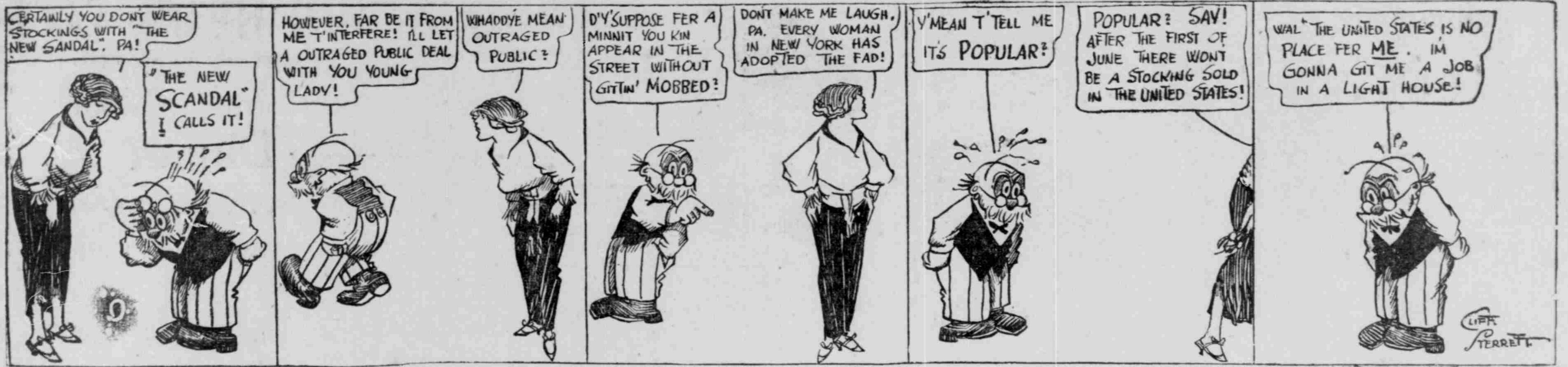

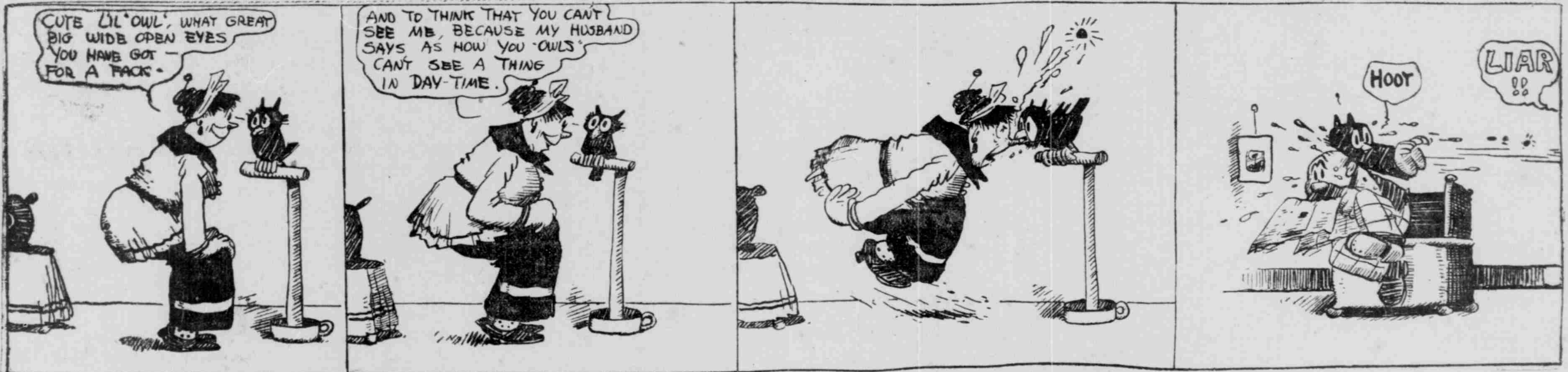

MUST PAY OR GO TO JAIL

Loren De Shong Owes Wife \$10 on Court Allowance.

To pay his wife \$10, due her on the allowance ordered her by the court, pending the hearing of her suit for separate maintenance or to spend 30 days as the guest of Sheriff Swanson in the county jail was the sentence passed out Monday afternoon by Judge Van Fleet in the superior court to Loren N. De Shong.

De Shong was sued for separate maintenance by his wife, Hazel C. De Shong. The suit is still pending and in the meantime the judge ordered the payment of \$2.50 a week by De Shong. The latter was in court Monday and heard his wife testify that he had failed to make the payments required by the court.
