3,758 TOTAL CASUALTY LIST

Nearly One-half of Men of Army Number From Pennsylvania. WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—Including 823 announced today, army and marine corps casualties received from overseas and made public since Monday when the toll of the victory on the Marne-Alame front began to come in now total 3,758.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—Including 823 announced today, army and marine corps casualties received from overseas and made public since Monday when the toll of the victory on the Marne-Alame front began to come in now total 3,758. Six army lists given out today contained 571 names, including 333 missing in action, and the one marine corps list had 52 names. The combined lists today showed an increase of 181 over those yesterday, but their total was less than that of any one of the other three days this week.

Nearly one-half of the men named in the army lists today were from Pennsylvania, the total from that state being 239, of whom 79 lived in Philadelphia. The other men named were from various states.

The army lists combined and the marine corps list show: Killed in action... 153; Died of wounds... 9; Died of accidents... 1; Died of disease... 333; Missing in action... 333; Wounded severely... 29; Wounded, (street un-... 41; 30; Wounded slightly... 2; Total... 571; 52.

AMERICAN SCHOONER SUNK OFF EAST COAST. NEWPORT NEWS, Va., Aug. 10. The American schooner Stanley L. Seaman, bound from Newport News to a foreign port, was sunk last Monday 119 miles east of Cape Hatteras by a German submarine. Capt. W. C. McAlooney and crew of eight men arrived today at this port, having been picked up by a British vessel.
