

# Western Open Golf Championship Won by St. Louis Man

## BARNES IS OPEN GOLF CHAMPION

### Sunset Club Man Is Never Overhauled From the First Day.

CLEVELAND, O., July 26.—Equaling the world's championship, James Barnes, Sunset Hill club, St. Louis, Friday won the western open golf championship from 163 leading golfers of America over the 6,240 yard links of the Mayfield Country club leading Leo Diegel of Detroit by three strokes and Jock Hutchinson of Chicago, by four.

Barnes also earned the distinction of being the only one to win the title three times. He won in 1914 at the Interlachen club, Minneapolis and in 1917, at the Westmoreland club, Chicago, where he set the lowest score recorded for 72 holes medal play. He held the title over 1918 on account of the war.

In addition to the three leaders, Fred McLeod of Washington and Otto Hackbart of Cincinnati, with 258 each, Bob McDonald of Chicago, with 291, Walter Hagen of Detroit, national champion, and Harry Hampton of Richmond, Va., with 292 each, and Willie Kidd of St. Louis, with 296 also finished in the money while George Sargent of Minneapolis, Emmett French of York, Pa., and Tom Boyd of Fix Hills, N. Y., tied for tenth place.

Barnes led from the start, scoring a record of 49, one under par for the heavily trapped course on Wednesday. He took par 70 for the second round on Thursday, leading the field by four strokes.

Friday morning he went out in 35, one under par, but got tangled on the second hole for 38, making his total 212 for 54 holes. Diegel with a 69 Friday morning came within two strokes of overhauling the champion, but with a 71 Friday afternoon, Barnes added one to his lead as Diegel took 72.

Among those who withdrew before the final round Friday was A. P. Meyering of St. Paul.
