

**GARFIELD ENROLLS  
624 STUDENTS; 182  
NEW ONES ENTER**

With 182 new pupils, 93 boys and 89 girls, entering from the sixth grades, enrollment at Garfield Junior High School totalled 624 students Friday morning whereas the opening enrollment last September was 555 pupils. This is the largest enrollment in the history of the school.

Study halls and session rooms are amply large, but recitation rooms will be crowded, according to Principal N. C. Helronimus.

In elementary and industrial work the entering boys are evenly divided with 46 7B boys registered for the former and 47 for the latter pre-vocational work. A considerable number of girls, too, are enrolled for industrial courses, while Latin and French are getting an even enrollment from new pupils, both boys and girls.

Miss Annie Wilson, instructor in history, who because of ill health was granted a semester's leave of absence last September, is not able to return. Miss Lucille Mayr, who has been substituting in her place, will remain as a member of the school staff, for the spring semester.

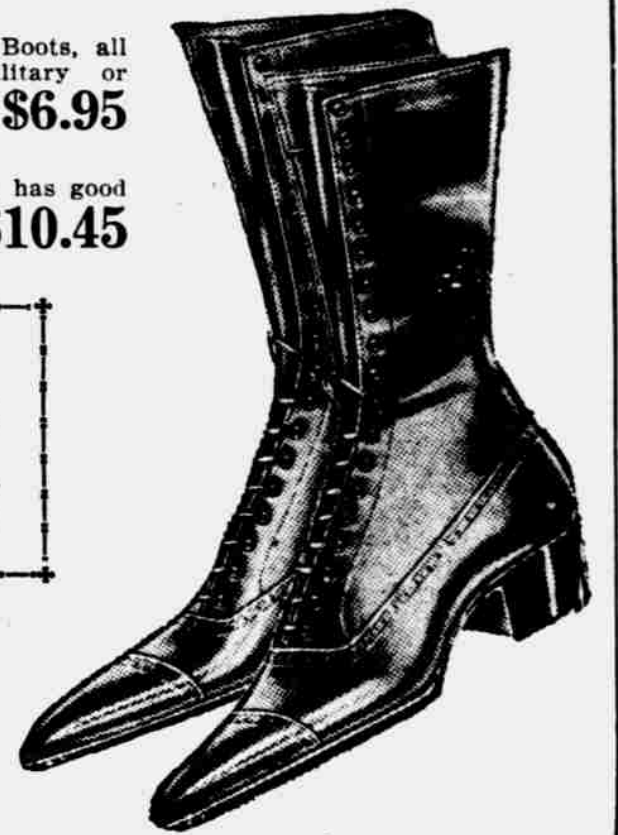
