

FACTORY EMPLOYEE HELD FOR ARSON

Goshen Man Said By Police to Be Responsible For Big Fire.

GOSHEN, Ind., Aug. 25.—Louis Blender, 33, of Goshen, married and a Goshen factory employe, is in the Elkhart county jail, here, charged with arson and unable to procure \$5,000 bail.

Arrested following destruction of the Phillips Bros. cooperage plant in this city in a mysterious blaze last July, Blender was placed under \$500 bond. Two days ago Tony George of Marion, Ind., deputy Indiana state fire marshal, came to Goshen and examined Blender. Today an alleged confession was secured from the prisoner, in which he is said to have admitted causing the Phillips Bros. cooperage blaze and the burning of Luther E. Bartholomew's barn, in which an automobile was destroyed.

In 1908 Blender admitted setting fire to the unoccupied plant of the Goshen Rubber company and was sent to Jeffersonville reformatory. While he was imprisoned incendiary fires in Goshen ceased. Soon after his release they again became common. Invariably Blender was among the first person on the scene at a fire where incendiary seemed certain and often he turned in alarms.

Confines His Operations. In nearly all his operations he confined himself to one section of the city. Residents there and owners of several large factories that barely escaped destruction appealed to Goshen authorities for special protection and the deputy state fire marshal was called. Much live stock perished in fires that are declared to have been caused by Blender touching a match.

Blender, it is said, is addicted to excessive use of liquor and drugs. Several weeks ago he was found in a helpless state in an interurban car in South Bend and taken to a hospital in that city, where, upon regaining consciousness, he explained that he did not try to commit suicide, as was suspected, but that he had taken alcohol and carbolic
