SOLDIER VICTIM OF LOCAL VICE LOSES HIS MIND Member of American Legion Sent to Institute at Marion, Ind.

One of the first world war veterans who will enter the new Marion, Ind., home for feeble minded under the direction of the United States public health service is a man from Warsaw, Ind. This man, whose name is withheld because of his wife and child, and the fact that he had an unspotted military record, owes his condition to wide open conditions existing in South Bend, according to American Legion men who investigated the case. Case is Reported. A thorough investigation of the case was made and reported to the surgeon in charge of the state public health service at Indianapolis by members of the legion. It was found that the young man visited this city and an invitation of several friends "sipped out" for the evening. He contracted a disease in one of the downtown dives and this is said to have caused him to lose his mind. The soldier served in the United States army overseas and had an enviable record for bravery while in the front line trenches. Denounce Protected Vice. In making the report of the case to federal authorities the Legion men, in no uncertain terms, condemned the practice of protected houses of prostitution where liquor is sold in South Bend. The case was presented to the Indiana public health service men at the second annual convention of the American Legion at Cleveland, O., Wednesday by the delegate from Warsaw. As soon as the new hospital for the treatment of service men is completed the doctors in charge promised to see that the man was transferred.
