When we shall have a country and a Government for our children to live in peace and happiness, it shall be time for each of us to return to our party banners according to our own convictions of right and duty. Let him be marked as no true patriot who will not abandon all such issues in times like this.

**THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE.**—The message scarcely calls for criticism. It is not such a state paper as former Presidents were in the habit of sending forth to the world. The occasion demanded a great effort—such an effort as Jackson made when he put forth his proclamation, in 1832, under somewhat similar circumstances—South Carolina being then, as she is now, a leader in rebellion against the Union. The President has not made as good use of the material at his command as he might have done, in showing to the erring and misguided States the outrage which they have committed in attempting to separate themselves from the Union, and the difficulties which beset them in their efforts to preserve their assumed independence. He could have done this with great force and pungency, at the same time that he preserved his good temper toward those States, and showed an earnest desire for their return to the fold of the Union.—*St. Louis Republican.*

**FREMONT AT CHURCH.**—Fremont attended Beecher's church last Sabbath. At the conclusion of the services the congregation rose, and a general rush was made for the pew in which Fremont and lady sat. Hundreds of hands were outstretched to greet him, and after submitting to a severe manipulation for about half an hour, he and company made their exit from the church followed by the congregation. As soon as the Major-General and his party were seated in their carriage, the crowd got up a cheer, and continued to surround the carriage, shaking hands with himself and lady until the patience of the latter was nearly worn out, and directions were given to the driver to go ahead, which he did, and the crowd followed the carriage nearly as far as the Fulton Ferry where the party got aboard and returned to New York.—*N. Y. Herald.*

A correspondent of the Indianapolis Journal, writing from Paducah, dated Dec. 1, says: "It is rumored that Major-General Halleck is soon to remove his headquarters to Paducah, bringing the majority of his army with him. If this does not betoken warm deeds, nothing does. Many rumors are afloat in camp; One to the effect that the army is soon to advance upon Columbus, that Malakoff of the Southern possessions. From our spies it is ascertained that the enemy have fifty-four regiments in that place, and that forty-five heavy pieces of artillery are ready and eager to give us a slight taste of 'good things yet to come.'
