CHEAP PAINT FOR ROUGH FENCES OF OUT-HOUSES, ETC. The Scientific American says: Pulverized charcoal and litharge (oxide of lead,) in equal quantities, mixed with raw linseed oil, makes a cheap and very durable dark-brown paint for rough boards of out-houses.

This appears to be a good recipe, if charcoal can be conveniently pulverized finely. It would need to be passed through a fine sieve to remove the lumps of coal. Probably the coal dust with the litharge would form a good body, while the litharge would make it dry rapidly.

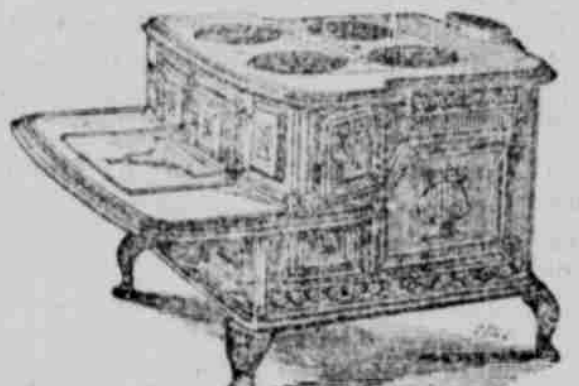

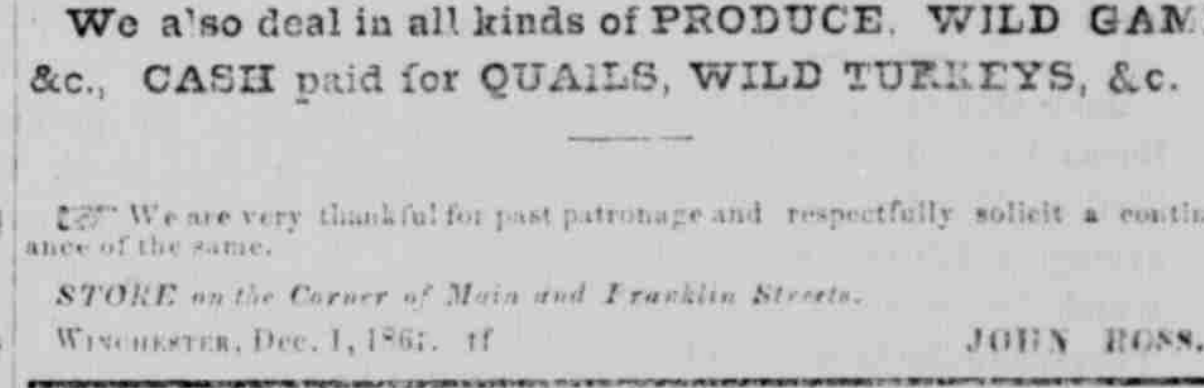
