The Chicago Times, by special telegrams from all points, gives the result of the pork packing of 1873. In Chicago, the returns received on Saturday last from the various local packers of their business from Nov. 1, 1873, to the 21st inst., aggregate 1,060,668 head, against 695,305 head for the same time last year.
