Louisville, May 18. - The steam ram Swanton, got aground in the canal to-day, preventing the passage of boats. The steamer Glendale, with hospital stores for Pittsburg Landing, was obliged to return to Cincinnati, as there is but two feet water on the falls.

Corinth, May 18. - The steamer Swan from Pittsburg Landing has arrived. News unimportant. A picket skirmish had taken place, lasting nearly two days. The rebels were driven back, but not until they succeeded in burning a bridge over a small stream four miles from Corinth.

News from our fleet says several gunboats had come around Creighton Point, yesterday to reconnoiter. The Benton opened fire as soon as they came in range. The rebels retreated.

Gen. Sherman's division lost forty-four killed and a considerable number wounded in attacking Russell's house which the rebels have occupied for sometime past, worrying the pickets. We succeeded in driving the enemy from his position back to his works.

Deserters from Corinth all report the entire absence of McClellan in the morning. There is probably none in the Confederacy. The weather is very warm, and the roads quite dusty.
