WAR NOT WANTED

The Czar and His Councilors Conclude to Adopt Pacific Measures.

ENGLAND'S INFLUENCE

It is Said Has Materially Changed the Warlike Policy of the Russian Government.

Advice From the Far East Today Certain Nothing of an Alarmist Nature.

London, Jan. 12.—The Times' Tokyo correspondent says that in recent speeches by publicists the claim was made that Japan is fighting for Anglo-Saxon ideals in Asia instead of military despotism and that several Tokyo journals rejoice that "America is now in the same camp with Japan."

The Russian correspondents of the Times hear that a special council presided over by the Czar arrived at the conclusion that war should be averted. The inference, they say, is that the speech of Premier Balfour at Manchester Jan. 11, in which he said: "No one can contemplate hostilities between two great civilized countries without feelings of misgiving and of depression," declaring that Great Britain would carry out to the fullest extent all her treaty obligations, greatly influences this decision.

SITUATION IN JAPAN

The People Calmly Awaiting the Word for War.

Tokio, Jan. 12.—Japan does not anticipate Russia's rejoinder for at least one week. In the meantime the nation is prepared and grimly reconciled to war. Political and other distinctions have disappeared and the country is patriotically united.

The Japanese people would welcome an honorable peace, but are resolved to fight before receding from their position in Oriental affairs. They fear the aggression of Russia and believe if it is not stopped now it will never be stopped.

Korea Given Notice.

Seoul, Jan. 12.—M. Pavloff, the Russian minister at Seoul, has notified the Korean government that Korean troops have crossed the Chinese boundary repeatedly and committed excesses against the inhabitants. Russian customs officials on the extreme northeastern border report similar occurrences and assert that the Koreans are burning villages and killing people. Minister Pavloff warned the authorities that such proceedings will necessitate severe measures.

Franz Joseph Has Hopes.

Vienna, Jan. 12.—During a general presentation Emperor Francis Joseph said to Ambassador Storer: "I think that affairs are going to be better in the far East. Everything will be arranged."
