TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION MEETING..

PREPARED BY PROF. W. A. FISKE.

Yesterday the Wayne County Teachers' Association held its first meeting of the year in the auditorium of the High school building. Mr. F. L. Townsend, the president, occupied the chair. The program was opened at 10:30 a. m. with a selection by the High School orchestra, after which Dr. Madison Swadener conducted the devotional exercises. He read three separate passages from the gospels and in a brief address which followed pointed out the underlying principles of these portions of scripture and that if they were closely followed by men this world would be lifted to a much higher plane.

This was followed by another selection from the orchestra which was well received by the audience of teachers.

President Torrence, in a few well chosen words now introduced the speaker of the hour, Prof. Edwin F. Starbuck, who is in charge of the department of education of Earlham College. Prof. Starbuck is an interesting speaker, and pleased his audience with what he had to say.

His subject, "The Inside Weather" was somewhat odd, but before he had advanced far it became evident that he was presenting some good thing in a very lucid manner.

The speaker's interpretation of the subject, "The Inside Weather," is based upon the thing which gives the particular atmosphere to the home, the church or the school.

There is an indefinable something that one recognizes at once on entering these institutions, which makes them desirable or undesirable places to be.

The factors which go to produce this atmosphere are (1) the personality of the teacher, (2) the sensitiveness of human life in receiving impressions from outside influences and (3) in again passing emotions over to the outside world.

These three phases of the subject after stating were discussed by the speaker in the reverse order. Many interesting experiments of a physiological nature were given to illustrate the thought and make the argument more conclusive.

The afternoon session convened at 1:30 o'clock. The program consisted first of two or three musical numbers by the Ladies chorus of the High School conducted by Prof. Will Earhart, followed by the second address of Prof. Starbuck. The speaker took for his subject, "The Influence of Submerged part of our

Lives. He compared life to an iceberg. One tenth of which is above the surface while nine tenths lie below. It is even so with life. The significant part of life is the invisible part and not that part we see which are the individual characteristics that stick up above the surfaces of our natures. The visible portion is too often the one upon which we are influenced in our relations to others.

The part of life above and the part below are however continuous, are constantly passing over in each other.

In relation to the school it is the duty of the teacher to teach the submerged part of child life.

This may be accomplished by introducing in the program those branches which have to deal directly with life, and by constantly cultivating in school the proper attitude to the real life about us.

At the close of this address a business meeting of the association was held, the business of which was included in the following resolutions which were unanimously adopted by the association.

Resolutions.

Resolved, That members of the Wayne County Teachers' Association congratulate our County Superintendent on the successful management of the County Institute held last August in connection with the Richmond Chautauqua.

We also respectfully request the County Institute of next year be conducted in a similar manner, provided in the judgment of the county superintendent suitable business arrangements can be made with the Chautauqua Association and provided the quality and standing of the lecturers and other talent employed on the program of the Chautauqua be of a high standing when considered in the light of the best interests of the educational growth of the county.

Resolved, That we, the members of the Wayne County Teachers' Association express our thanks to Dr. Starbuck for the two earnest and helpful addresses he has given today, and our high appreciation of the fact that he has moved into Wayne county to make it his home, and to become one of its corps of educational workers.

Resolved, That we, as members of the Wayne County Teachers' Association extend to the president and board of trustees of Earlham College our appreciation of their action in establishing at Earlham a college department of education. We con-

gratulate them on this important movement, believing that it will mean much to the educational interests of our county, and we pledge the support of this association to the work of the educational department at Earlham at all times. After the passage of these resolutions President Kelly and Dr. Starbuck both expressed their highest appreciation of such an action by the teachers of Wayne county, and felt assured that because of such great harmony in the county and throughout the State, among educational workers, results much greater than heretofore would surely follow.

Upon motion the association adjourned after a most interesting session.

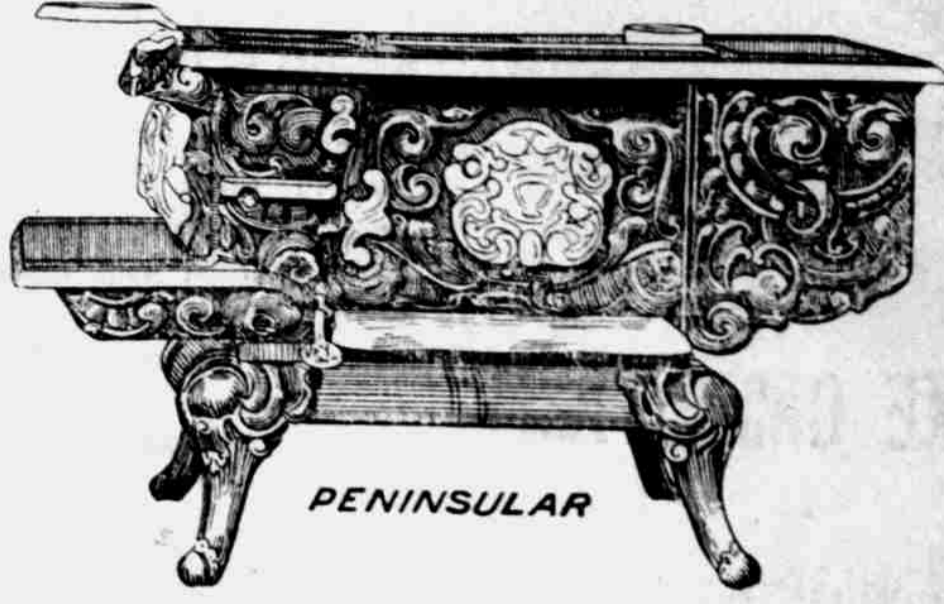

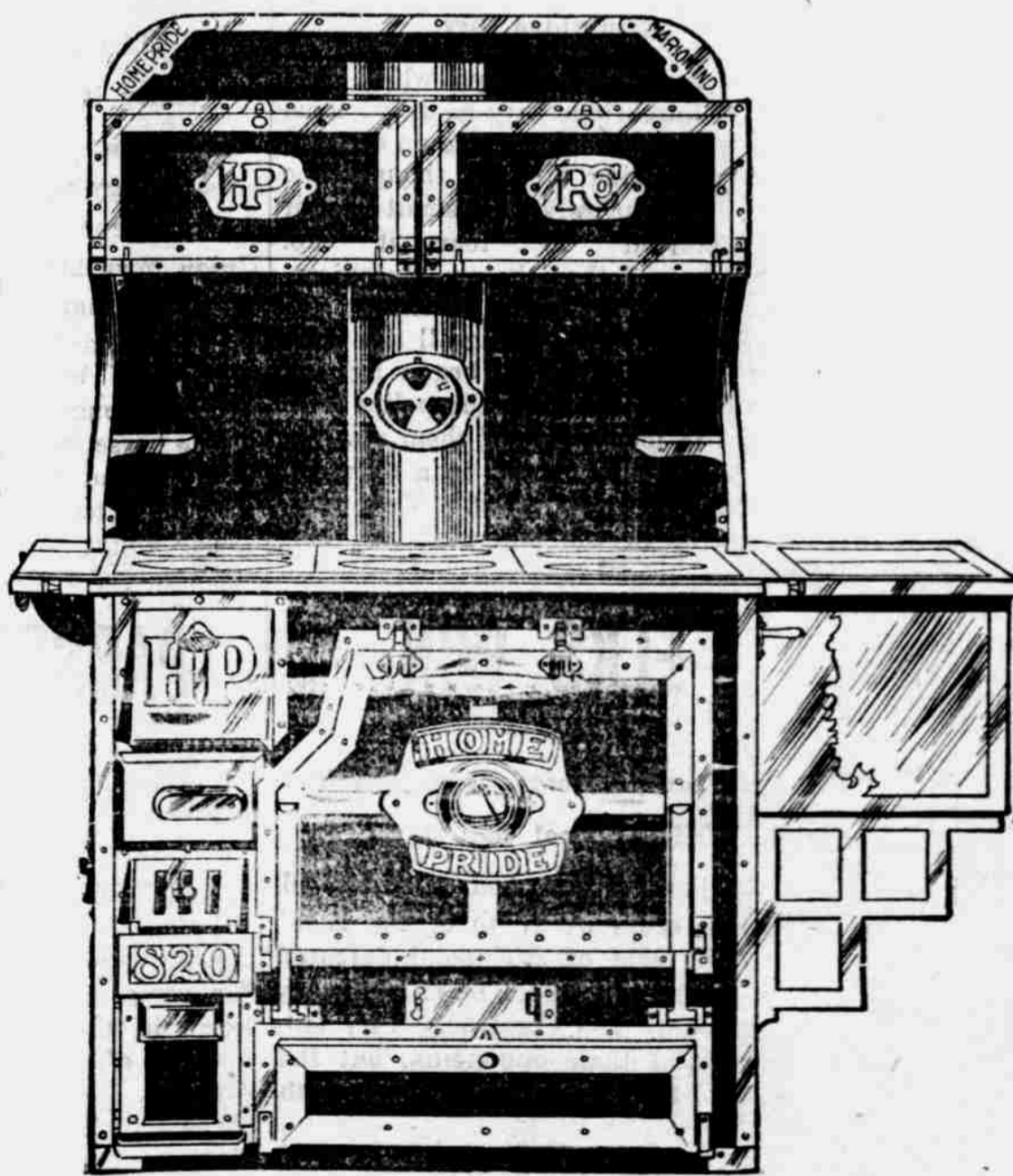
