

HILLIS FORGING AHEAD IN RACE, BACKERS CLAIM

'Voters Seeking Kind of Man We Are Sponsoring,' Says Manager.

Leaders of the campaign of Glen R. Hillis, Kokomo, for the Republican gubernatorial nomination, today said a survey of the state has revealed that voters "are seeking the kind of a man we are sponsoring."

Edmund M. Wassmuth, Huntington, former G. O. P. state chairman, said:

"During the past few weeks Mr. Hillis has visited each district in the state, and in every instance his personality and his sincerity in wishing to carry out the task of returning the people's government to the people have brought him support."

Vincennes Mayor Rewards Revenue Collector for Care With Wine.

Mayor Joseph W. Kimmel of Vincennes has the case of champagne sent him by Mayor Leon Bonvison of Vincennes, France, safe at home today, but it is short two bottles. Mr. Kimmel yesterday presented Will H. Smith, internal revenue collector, with a bottle, and gave another to Gov. McNulty.

"We are going to use the champagne, well, part of it, anyhow, to christen the new cruiser Vincennes at Quincy, Mass., May 21," Mayor Kimmel said.

"Four city councilmen and other Vincennes residents are to accompany my wife, daughter and me to the ceremony. And, in June, I am going to France to thank Mayor Bonvison personally for this gift."

Virginia Kimmel, 23, daughter of the Mayor, is scheduled to break a bottle of rare wine—it's the Pol Roger, vintage of 1926—over the bows of the new fighting ship.

"I have had a correspondence of three or four years duration with Mayor Bonvison," Mr. Kimmel said. "The Vincennes (Ind.) post of the American Legion exchanged flags with the corresponding organization of Vincennes, France, several years ago. Then, when the Normandie first came over, Vincennes, France, sent us an album full of photographs, a box of confections and a metal casket containing earth from the French City."
