Knights and Daughters of Honor

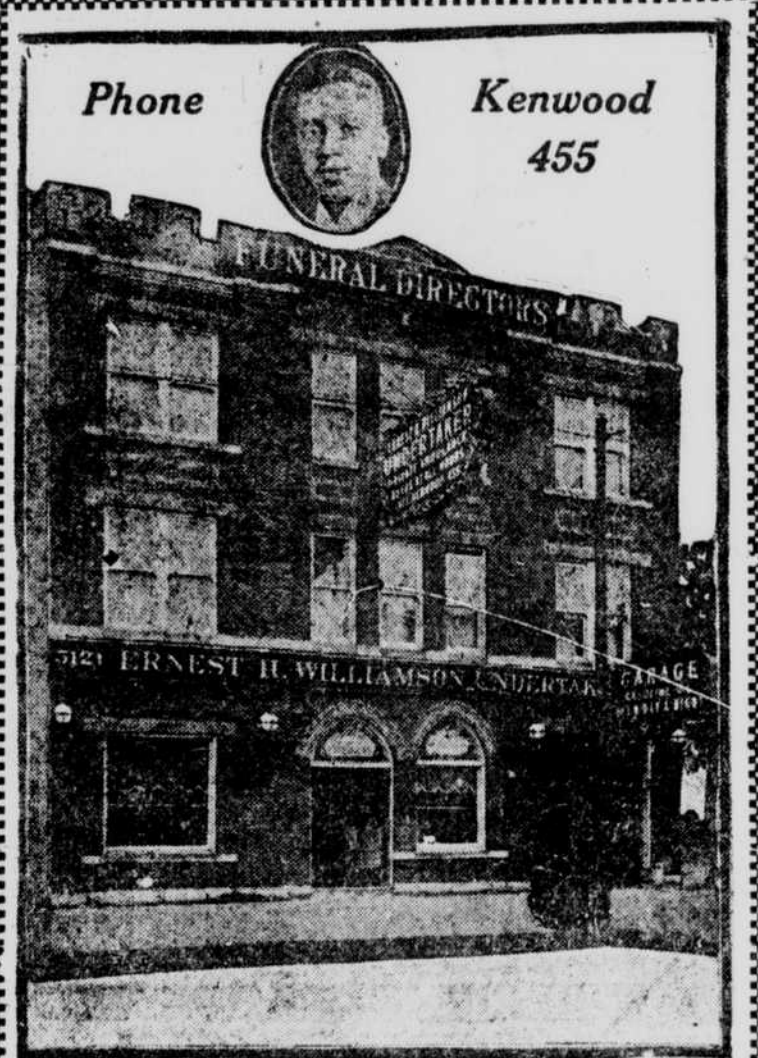
The Knights and Daughters of Honor will hold a joint meeting and installation of officers Monday evening, May 29, at K. P. Hall, 207 East 35th Street.
