Mr. Mole Has Fine Panoramic Camera.

The picture recently published in LEAVES OF HEALING, showing hundreds who have never tasted medicine, was taken by Mr. Arthur S. Mole with a camera known as the Circuit Panoramic Camera. Mr. Mole purchased this camera recently so as to take large groups or processions. He can now take pictures eight inches wide and up to eight feet long.

The camera revolves on a tripod bed. The film is wound up by means of clock-work springs, and releases itself as the camera revolves. By using a tele-photo lens attachment, objects at a distance can be drawn close. He can also arrange a group in a complete circle and take the picture as easily as if they were in a straight line. By a very ingenious arrangement the operator is enabled to determine before he exposes his film, just how long a photograph of the view decided on will make. Any part of the complete circle can be used as desired. An indicator located at the top of the film holder shows the exact length of film exposed.
