Sanitary Notice.

The cleanliness and health of the City demand that garbage and junk be properly disposed of. Garbage cans and junk boxes should be provided at the alley for each residence. Some who have septic tanks are in the habit of smuggling garbage and junk into concealed places, or, perhaps, piling it on vacant lots. This practice cannot be tolerated, and must stop.

Every household is expected to help support the Scavenger and Garbage Department. The fee for those using septic tanks is 75c a quarter; but for those not having septic tanks, but who are served every week by the Department, there is no extra charge.

A large number of people shirk payment of fees for sanitary service, and that class is hereby notified to call at the office of the Commissioner of Health and settle back accounts, and thereby avoid proceedings under the ordinance.
