





Poultry Talks (Continued from page 198)

DRY MASH

- 100 lbs. bran
- 200 lbs. middlings or shorts
- 200 lbs. corn meal
- 300 lbs. ground oats
- 250 lbs. beef scraps
- 75 lbs. alfalfa meal
- 50 lbs. gluten meal
- 25 lbs. oil meal O. P.
- 8 lbs. fine salt
- 35 lbs. powdered charcoal

WINTER GRAIN FOOD

- 200 lbs. cracked corn
- 100 lbs. wheat

FOR SUMMER

- 100 lbs. cracked corn
- 200 lbs. wheat

Equal parts of corn and wheat in the spring and fall.
Some part of the dry mash moistened with buttermilk and fed once a day.
Grit, shells and sprouted oats, or other green feed.

AT STORES, CONNECTICUT, OR NORTH AMERICAN CONTEST

they used the following method:

- 200 lbs. coarse wheat bran
- 100 lbs. corn meal
- 100 lbs. gluten feed
- 100 lbs. ground oats
- 75 lbs. middlings
- 30 lbs. fish scrap
- 25 lbs. low grade flour
- 30 lbs. beef scrap

GRAIN SCRATCH

- 60 lbs. cracked corn

- 60 lbs. wheat
- 40 lbs. white oats
- 20 lbs. barley
- 10 lbs. Kafir corn
- 10 lbs. buckwheat
- 10 lbs. coarse beef scrap

These different kinds or ingredients are thoroughly mixed before feeding. The grain is fed morning and evening at the rate of one pint for ten hens in the morning and one and a half pints in the evening. The mash is open before the hens at all times.

A mash made up of the above is moistened with milk or water and fed in the afternoon, what they will eat in thirty minutes.

Oyster shells, grit and fresh water are always kept before the hens.

Mr. Quisenberry who has had charge of this experimental station a number of years has been in the poultry business a good number of years, and is an authority on the subject. He conducts a poultry correspondence school also. We will give later on some of the results and lessons of these contest and experiments.
