### Important Notice

There are quite a number of cases of Whooping Cough in this City at present and notice is hereby given that none of these cases must be taken to Fourth of July rallies or picnics, nor to any meetings of any kind until well.

Some people are so thoughtless and inconsiderate of the comfort and feelings of others as to deliberately break over this rule. Keep your children away from houses where you see the placard.

The Board of Health has lately put out the order that all toilet buildings must be located on the alley, and that they must be raised at least four inches from the surface of the ground to avoid the trouble and destruction of property incident to freezing and thawing weather, when the scavenger and garbage man is often compelled to either damage or entirely force the trap-door from its hinges. Surely every person interested can see the necessity of this or-

der, and all will be expected to comply without further notice from this Board.

Toilets constructed in connection with barns, coal sheds or chicken houses, cannot comply with this order, and in such cases will only be required to saw off the bottom of the trap-door so that it swings clear of the surface, but in all such cases the building must be located on the alley.
