BRILLIANCY A POOR SUBSTITUTE FOR HARD MENTAL EFFORT

It is said that in one of the last experiments of the late Professor Munsterberg, he put each member of a class of 276 students through a careful psychological examination, without any knowledge of their class attainments. He graded the men according to their mental capacities, dividing them into three groups—high, moderate and low. He then turned to their class records and compared each man's mental grade with his actual accomplishments. The men of medium or low grade, with but a few notable exceptions, had surpassed those of high mental capacity. The plodders and workers had surged ahead, while their more brilliant companions, depending upon their natural ability to carry them through and spending their time in gaiety and ease, had remained in the mediocre class.
