Chief of Police Becker has been appointed by Mayor Clendinen as Quarantine Officer of the City of Zion, with full authority to enforce and carry out all quarantine regulations. Health Officer N. J. La Rose will cooperate with Deacon Becker by reporting any cases of contagious disease, and advising as to progress of same from time to time; but the authority to release from quarantine will rest with Deacon Becker, alone. It will also be the duty of the police force to visit any neighborhoods in which quarantine regulations are in force, and investigate as to whether there are any violations of same or not. Zion believes absolutely in the strictest enforcement of quarantine rules in all cases of contagious disease; the law must be obeyed to the letter, and no leniency or favoritism will be shown.
