The Jewish Position in Occupied Territory

The settlement which Germany has imposed upon Russia, if it be allowed to stand, must have profound and far-reaching effects upon the Jewish people. It will in fact modify the whole of the Jewish world position. It will make Germany, counting it in respect of Jewish population, a great, probably the greatest, Jewish power; for, as has been remarked, "placed as Jewry is in the world, its moral momentum is necessarily decided by weight of sheer numbers."

The Jewish race has indeed passed through some strange and wonderful experiences since the fateful August of 1914. Who thought then that the Pale of Settlement would be first set free and then almost completely torn from Russia and put under German over-lordship? Yet that is what has happened. And tomorrow who knows what may become of the strip of Europe stretching from the Baltic to the Black Sea in which is centered so large an aggregation of our people, the scene of so much of Jewish anxiety and so much of Jewish hope? But suppose the settlement between Russia and Germany stands. The chief effect upon the Jews involved will undoubtedly be the substitution of the pseudo-scientific and anti-Semitism of Germany for the age-long tyranny of Tzardom, extinguishing at the same time the newborn hope of complete liberty in Russia.

Nobody can tell what intensification in German anti-Semitism will result from the virtual turnover to Germany of some five or six millions of Jews. Long ago learned German professors were suggesting the exclusion of the Jews of occupied Russian territory from Germany proper.

As for the Jewish position generally, will our people in the provinces segregated under the *aegis* of Germany withstand the corroding influences of German *kultur* as they have withstood the treatment of Tzardom? Will, on the other hand, the former be more effectual than has been the latter in weaning them away from the faith of their fathers?

These are questions for deep pondering upon the part of the Jews. And the effect of a Germany victorious in the East upon the prospects of Jewish Nationalism in Palestine must also by no means be overlooked. That Palestine should be free from the influence of Turkey and from that of Germany is the keynote of British as it is the brightest hope of Zionist policy. It is quite evident that Germany's policy is exactly contrary. What is not so evident at the moment is the extent to which her intentions in regard to Palestine are helped by the Russian peace; but that they will be greatly promoted there can be no manner of doubt.

This, however, is all upon the assumption and, let us hope, the baseless assumption that the arrangements which Germany has forced upon Russia will stand for the Peace. If they do, they must mean a triumph for German militarism, and that the powers of civilization ranged on the side of England have determined shall never be. It

will not be if the allied nations determine not to shrink from any sacrifice until, in one way and another, peace can be established on a just and durable basis. That will be a very different settlement, affording a very different prospect for the Jewish position from that which has just been come to between the Bolsheviks and the German militarist rulers. — *London Jewish Chronicle*.
