## FUNKHOUSER SQUAD CHARGED WITH FRAMING EVIDENCE ON WOMEN

Huldah Potter-Loomis Shocks Fashionable Women and  
Reformers by Attack on Morals Court and Funk-  
houser—Makes Plea for Girls of Underworld  
—Cites Case of "Countess Yorke"

Mrs. Huldah Potter Loomis, who yesterday shocked social workers and reformers by her speech against the morals court in the open forum at the Masonic Temple, today followed that speech with another just as bristling.

Yesterday she spoke on the "immoral morals court." Today she condemned the psyeopathic laboratory and the methods of Major Funkhouser.

She accused Funkhouser and his morals squad of "framing" and of manufacturing evidence on women brought into the morals court. She

touched on that yesterday in the forum, crowded with society women. After her speech a small man, wearing a tin badge, forced his way up to the speaker and asked her if she had proof of her charges.

Mrs. Loomis then spoke of the arrest of the "Countess Yorke," formerly the wife of George Meade, the advertising man, in her fashionable apartments of Fullerton parkway.

"The evidence against the countess was thin," she said. "One of the investigators by hook or crook managed to get himself into the Yorke
