Corn Starch Omelet.

Separate the yolks of 2 eggs from the white. Beat up the yolks in a small basin and add a pinch of salt. Blend 1 tablespoonful of cornstarch with $\frac{3}{4}$ of a cupful of milk and add the yolks to it. Season with pepper and salt and fold in the stiffly beaten whites. Put $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoonful of butter into the pan. Let it get hot, then pour in the mixture slowly. Shake the pan gently over the fire. When the omelet is set and the under side slightly browned, put it in the oven till the upper side is browned. Add 1-tablespoonful of cooked, chopped chicken or cooked ham, tongue or kidney. Double over and put on a hot dish. Serve at once.
