

## WHAT HAPPENED OUTSIDE CHICAGO

**Seoul.**—Judge Tsukuhara refused to listen to testimony supporting the alibis claimed by several of the 123 Koreans on trial charged with plotting to assassinate Gov. Gen. Terauchi.

**Philadelphia.**—Transport Prairie, with 750 marines, supply of stores and ammunitions of war aboard, was to sail from government navy yards here today.

It will go to Colon, where the marines will take train across to the Isthmus and board and board the armed cruiser California, which will take them to scene of the Nicaraguan troubles.

**Indianapolis.**—Earl Breedlove, 21, dragged 115 feet when train struck wagon in which he was riding. Internally injured.

**Erie, Pa.**—Considerable damage done in surrounding country by cyclone and waterspout that passed over this vicinity late yesterday.

**Terre Haute, Ind.**—Three boys killed, one fatally injured and three badly cut when Southern Indiana passenger train ran down a party of boys here today.

**Pekin, Ill.**—J. L. Smith, rescued after being imprisoned for 26 hours in a caisson 30 feet below the Illinois river, died of shock and injuries inflicted by a derrick used to haul him out.

**Saint Mato, France.**—The first hydro-aeroplane race meet ever held began here this afternoon. The automobile club offered prizes worth \$7,500.

**Aviators Weymann, American,** and Beaumont were the favorites.

**St. Paul, Minn.**—Pasquale Magliano, 50, will not be forced to return to Italy, where he claims the Black Hand society is trying to send him with the object of murdering him.

**New York.**—Rumored here that Lefty Louie, alleged Rosenthal murderer, has been trapped on steamer bound from Texas gulf port to New York.
