



HARDIE'S VIEWS.

The British Socialist Who is Visiting This Country.

HE SPEAKS AT A GOTHAM BANQUET

'Socialism the Salvation of the World' His Shibboleth—Remarks on the Situation in England—Debs' Opponents Dig Up One of His Editorials Written Some Years Ago—Schilling's Report on the Spring Valley Troubles—Industrial Notes.

NEW YORK, Aug. 25.—Kier Hardie, the British socialist and ex-member of parliament was given a dinner last night by the Central Labor Federation at Labor Lyceum. In a speech Hardie said that he was glad to meet face to face the men and women of America who are carrying the red flag of socialism to certain victory.

He thought he might pursue the same course under similar conditions. Morris wrote his poems for the satisfaction of his higher sensibilities. They were in a measure personal and for himself alone.

Hardie's dress is the same which created so much comment when he made his first appearance in parliament. A small gray cloth cap, on the back of his head, a gray woolen jacket, full woolen knee breeches, and dark worsted stockings.

'He is gazed by howery Arabs. Have you any particular plans in your visit here?' Hardie was asked. 'Like Howell's traveler in Altruria,' he replied, 'I have come here to learn. I have come to the conclusion that the labor movement is much the same all over the world.'

'There was some talk of a leaning toward Republicanism in England. Is that so?' 'No, it is not. The Republican movement has gone back considerably during the last twenty years. Twenty years ago it was a separate movement when Sir Charles Dilke, Charles Bradlaugh and some of the old Chartists were stamping the country on the Republican ticket.

Hardie's Party in Great Britain. The Independent Labor party, Hardie said, had a voting power of 50,000 and had won the most seats in the provinces than in London. 'Of course,' he continued, 'the membership is more than the voting power represents. Only householders in England can vote, and people must be residents for two years to entitle them to vote.'

PEOPLE WHO MYSTERIOUSLY DISAPPEAR OR LOSE THEMSELVES.

Some of Them Walk Out of Home Circles and Are Never Heard of Again—Aberation of Mind One of the Causes—Strange Cases of This Character.

In a community of 2,000,000 souls a man must be great indeed to command general notice. The young man who comes from the country, leaving behind him a happy fireside filled with loved ones and bringing with him only his fond mother's Bible and a few necessities, to try his luck in the city, comes unheralded, to be quickly swallowed up in a whirlpool of uninterested, selfish humanity.

There are thousands of dark corners in a great city, and in one of these he may be found dead, with marks of violence upon him. The coroner's jury may find a verdict of 'killed by some person unknown,' and, unidentified, the poor boy finds final rest in the pauper's grave, while the loved ones at home wonder at his silence that is never broken.

The scenes in the thoroughfares are kaleidoscopic, with instant changes. The stories of the disappearance and wanderings of the people are sometimes sad, but they are frequently amusing.

The Illinois labor arbitration board has organized, opened headquarters at Springfield and is now ready for business.

The president has issued an order abolishing the civil service age limit so far as printers and pressmen are concerned. Five at Cincinnati destroyed the five-story building and damaged another building, the whole costing the owners and insurance companies \$250,000.

One thousand garment workers have struck for less hours, more pay, and bond from employers to keep the agreement at Rochester, N. Y.

It is believed at Chicago that some food is poisoning the animals at Lincoln park. A baby lion has just died with evidence of arsenical poisoning.
