CANADIAN POLICE CLAIM THEY HAVE HARRY K. THAW UNDER ARREST

*Identity of Man Held in Coaticook, Quebec, Doubted by
U. S. Officials—Evelyn Nesbit Thaw Draws Big
Crowds to Theater With Her Talk About
Fearing Thaw Escaped to Kill Her.*

Coaticook, Que., Aug. 19.—Letters found on prisoner addressed to Harry K. Thaw, care of Matteawan Asylum, have convinced police of identity of man under arrest here.

New York, Aug. 19.—Each hour brings fresh rumors that Harry Thaw, millionaire madman, who escaped from the Matteawan Asylum last Sunday morning, has been seen by different persons in different parts of the country, and one report has it that he was taken from a train at Colebrook, N. H., and placed under arrest at Coaticook, Quebec, but so far none of these rumors have been verified.

Evelyn Nesbit Thaw is also still expressing, in hourly interviews, her fear that Harry has escaped only that he may "finish" her, and crowds are turned away from the doors of Hammerstein's Theater, where Evelyn is doing a vaudeville turn.

Evelyn's latest interview is to the effect that she does not believe Harry got away Sunday. She thinks he was free Saturday night, but what reason she has for thinking this she is keeping to herself. She is also sure
