## AMAZING DOUBLE LIFE OF GIRL WHO LIVED FOR YEARS AS A MAN

*Became So Mannish That First "Wife" Quarreled With  
Her—Cora Anderson, Back in Woman's Clothes,  
Tells Why She Did It—Stunning Story  
of Sex Life Turned Around.*

Milwaukee, Wis., May 13.—"Did this woman, as far as you know, wear male attire for immoral purposes? Did you ever see her do anything vulgar?" asked the judge in the case of "disorderly conduct" brought against Cora Anderson, who, until last week, as Ralph Kerwinleo, had worn men's clothes and posed as a man for thirteen years.

"No."

"While in male attire how did she act?" the judge continued.

"Like a PERFECT GENTLEMAN," was the policeman's answer, much to the amusement of the spectators who filled the police courtroom in Milwaukee.
