## THREE GREAT NATIONS DECIDE WAR MUST GO ON TO BITTER END

England, France and Germany Unwilling to Quit Now  
on Individual Basis—German Cruiser Sinks  
British Merchantmen.

*London, Sept. 5.—The war will continue to the bitter end. No one of the three great nations allied will consider peace on an individual basis. This was decided today and Sir Edward Grey, the British foreign minister and the French and Russian ambassador signed an agreement to that effect.*

*New York.—The German cruiser Karlsruhe in southern waters has been sinking British merchantmen, disabling cruisers, and marooning men and women on desert islands, according to passengers on the Clyde liner Algoquin.*
