BELGIANS OPEN DIKES AND FLOOD DROWNS GERMAN SOLDIERS

**Attempt to Isolate Antwerp From the Sea Checked—
French Siege Artillery Goes to Aid of Montenegro—Big Battle North of Paris.**

Antwerp, Sept. 27.—Declared many Germans drowned when Belgians opened dikes and flooded country southwest of Antwerp in effort to prevent German attempt to cut off Antwerp from sea. 5,000 Germans killed.

Washington.—French town of Senlis evacuated by allies. North and south movement of German army continues, according to French embassy.

Belgium—Belgians report that German attempt to cut Belgian line and isolate Antwerp from the sea has been checked by Belgians with heavy loss to the Germans.

Montenegro.—French heavy siege artillery has been
