David Young, 3444 S. Wabash av., negro, who shot and killed his wife Sept. 18, and turned the gun on himself, died at County Hospital.

Mrs. Rosa Lutz, 453 N. Union st., found gagged and unconscious in home last night. Two young men, posing as water inspectors, beat her and searched the house. Got \$95.
