### WAR BULLETINS

Antwerp.—In an official statement issued at 4 o'clock this afternoon, the Belgian war office announced that the German long-range bombardment of the outer chain of Antwerp fortifications has abated.

Berlin, Via Rome.—Max Linder, probably the most famous cinematograph artist in the world, has been killed in action at the battle of the Aisne.

Rome.—Italy takes step that is accepted as first steps leading to open break with Austria.

Washington.—Petrograd foreign office reports Russians have completely surrounded Przemysl.
