ITALY MAY BREAK TRIPLE ALLIANCE ---THREATENS WAR ON AUSTRIA

**Germans Drive French from Mulhausen—French Avia-
tion Corps Play Big Part in War—Liege Still
Holds Out—Report River Red With Blood.**

*London.—The war office press bureau today con-
firmed the report that the Russian invasion of Austria is
in progress. It states that a Russian army is advancing
through the Styr river valley toward Lemburg.*

*Washington.—Information concerning the mining
of the North Sea and the English channel was given to-
day to Secretary Bryan through the British embassy. Un-
derstood this information was a warning to save Ameri-
can ships.*

*Nish, Servia.—The war office announces that the
combined Servian and Montenegrin armies are rapidly
pushing forward through Bosnia. They have defeated
the Austrians with heavy losses.*
