## JAPAN READY TO STRIKE GERMANY ---ULTIMATUM EXPIRES SUNDAY

Only Complete Backdown by Kaiser Will Prevent Hos-  
tilities at Kiao-Chau—Japan's Feeling Toward  
United States Grows Much Warmer.

*Ghent.*—Main general army entered Brussels from  
Louvain this afternoon. Only cavalry had been in city  
before.

*Nish.*—Servian army is pursuing Austrian army,  
which was defeated Sunday, and inflicting severe losses  
on the invaders, according to semi-official advices here.  
The Servians seized six guns in an assault on the retreat-  
ing left wing of the Austrian army.

*Antwerp, via The Hague, Aug. 21.*—This city is be-  
ing placed in a state of siege. All foreigners will be  
asked to leave as soon as possible. King Albert and the  
general staff are now here. The forts are all manned.
