GRADING ROADS WITH A TRACTION ENGINE IN HENRY

Victor Clough, a Henry county man, thinks he has solved the question of grading county roads with his attachment for doing the work with a traction engine. In an interview he says:

"The work is hard on the gears and I am having the cast iron gears replaced by steel ones. The estimated number of yards of dirt moved per hour by use of the engine and side hitch is 1800, at a cost of one mill per yard at prices we are now getting. With men and teams to plow and scrape the same dirt would cost four times as much. The cost now per day is \$10.00 with the engine to \$65.00 with teams. The price for regrading roads by steam must be raised to \$25 per day to get cost out of the engine and grader. But even then it is a saving to the township of \$35 per day.

"To do this work requires large and costly engines and expert men to handle them. Then handling a grader requires a man of good judgment and a mechanical eye, and when he gets on to the work he is a valuable man. Almost to a man, the people that live on the roads now graded, say it is the only way to grade. The common expression is 'Such a saving of horse flesh, farmers will not put their horses on a grader any more.'
