**Woman Unconscious Two Hours Says She Was Given
Papers to Sign While Still in Daze—Asks
\$25,000 Damages.**

One of those stories that the trust press does not print broke today. It concerned Mandel Brothers and what happened to a shopper in that store.

Mrs. Yetta Engler drifted into Mandel's State street store one day last summer while doing her shopping. She took an elevator and when the third floor was called by the operator she got out.

The elevator door was slammed shut before she was altogether out, she says, and her sleeve and hand

caught when the gates came together. The quick jerk threw her back and down to the floor, knocking her unconscious.

For two hours, according to Att'y Leon Berezniak, she lay unconscious in the hospital of the store on the fifth floor. The fright at being jerked back toward the deep elevator shaft was too much for her—she was in a delicate condition at the time.

One of the first things she remembers when consciousness came to her, she says, was a woman pressing
