To make the coming affair, which Mendota's interesting manager says will recall that last season the Mendota club were very eager for a game with the locals and besides offered to bet a large amount of money on the side, that they could take the Cubs' team. They weren't taken up.

Rockford's Maroons also petitioned for a game this morning, but as they are a minor club they will not be given a chance to face the local stars according to Manager Dunn.

Fans Gained From Bench.
 Manager Dunn also wishes to announce that from now on the bench at the ball park is for only the players and the scorers. Anybody caught snatching the bench during a game will be given the boot and probably ordered from the park. There is plenty of room in the grandstand to seat a great many fans and besides no other teams allow the witnesses to occupy the players' bench. Last Sunday the drive against the bench loamers was limited when Officers James Fox and Thomas Bailey cleared the bench. Last year almost anybody was allowed to come and it caused considerable bench trouble. When the players were coming in after the opposing side had retired, those fellows who thought they knew something about the game, but who didn't know anything about it, were offering their advice and telling the locals how to play the game.

To prevent this the Cubs' association has adopted a final ruling prohibiting anybody from occupying the bench except Managers Benny Dunn, the players, the scorers and Pete Pond, who takes care of the scorebook.
