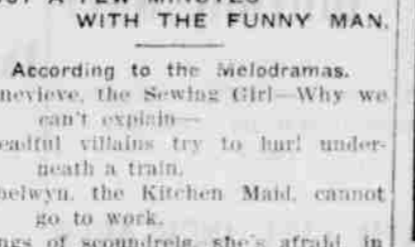

A Bird's Vision and Man's. By DR. CASEY A. WOOD, Noted Ophthalmologist.

As an example of the visual capacity of some birds one has but to think for a moment of a hawk poised several hundred yards above a meadow in which a chicken, or even so small a living object as a field mouse, is hidden.

Bird vision, then, is not only the highest expression of eyesight, both as to acuity and variety, but it repeats the oft-told tale of the correlation of sight in the animal to its life history as witnessed chiefly in the pursuit of food and the escape from death or injury.
