

SUPPORT SCHOOLS

President Urges That Education Be Not Neglected. Is Vital, He Says, Both in Time of War and in Peace.

Washington, Aug. 15.—Generous support of schools of all grades during war time is urged by President Wilson in a letter to Secretary Lane today approving the bureau of education's plan for an educational campaign this summer and fall.

"I am pleased to know," says the president's letter, "that despite the unusual burdens imposed upon our people by the war, they have maintained their schools and other agencies of education as nearly at their normal efficiency. That this should be continued throughout the war and that, in so far as the draft law will permit, there should be no falling off in attendance in elementary schools, high schools or colleges is a matter of the very greatest importance, affecting both our strength in war and our national welfare and efficiency when the war is over."

"So long as the war continues there will be constant need of very large numbers of men and women of the highest and most thorough training for war service in many lines. After the war there will be urgent need not only for trained leadership in all lines of industrial, commercial, social and civil life but for a very high average of intelligence and preparation on the part of all the people."

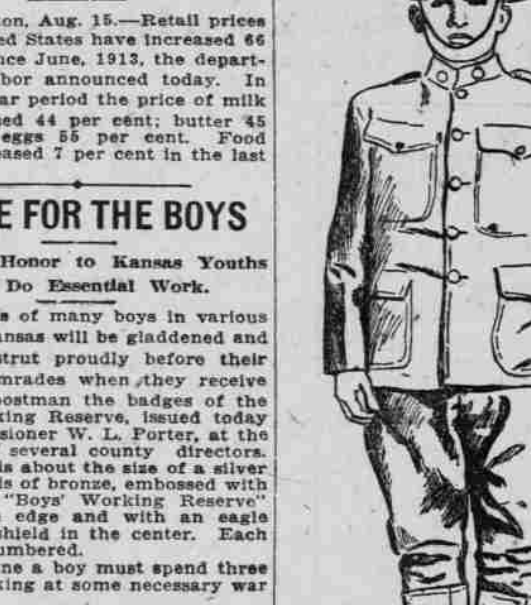
