COURSE IN HYGIENE

Home Nursing Feature of Red Cross Begins Next Week.

The third course in hygiene and home nursing to be given by the Topeka chapter of the American Red Cross will begin next week. Mrs. H. Breidel, chairman of the committee on home nursing, announced today that the registration would be Thursday from 11 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. The registration and the lectures will all be given at the Y. W. C. A. The course consists of instruction in taking care of the sick in the homes. It is intended to provide adequate care for patients where trained nursing is not available. The Red Cross and the army have taken such large numbers of trained nurses that there are not sufficient to handle the work in any community and the Red Cross has established this course of training for the women in every city that they may be able to give good care and proper treatment. The course does not prepare anyone to go outside their own home for nursing work.

During the registration Thursday the hours for the classes will be arranged to suit the convenience of the greatest number.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Things Worth Knowing.
For Child With Cold in Head—Cut old linen in six-inch squares. Make a dozen or two of these and place where they will be handy for the child with a bad cold in the head. Instruct the child to burn each one after using. The little ones like to use these, will save washing handkerchiefs and it is sanitary.

To Shell Elderberries—Soon will be the time for elderberries. To take from stem a coarse comb is a great help. To prevent staining the hands when shelling elderberries use a three of four-tined fork to pull them from the stems.

To Keep Flour—Nowadays one has many two-pound sacks of flour; the sacks become torn and spill easily. Some oatmeal boxes hold exactly two pounds of flour; they are large enough to dip a cup or scoop into and when marked on the top of cover "barley," "wheat" or "rye" they not only save the flour but look neat in the bargain.
