Four Years for Blake.

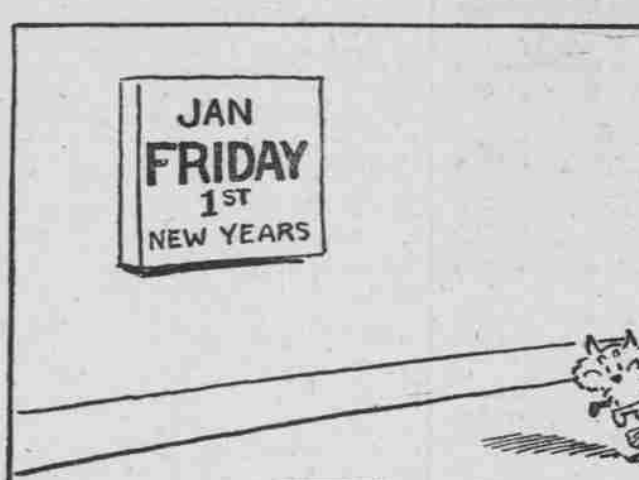

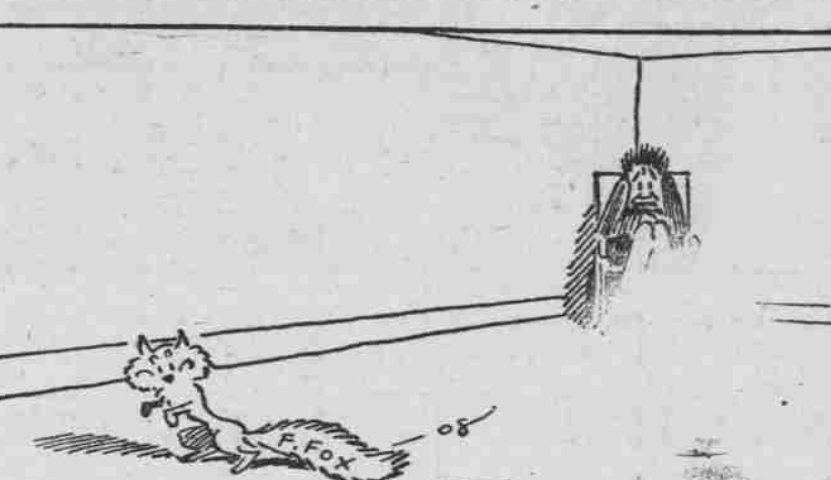
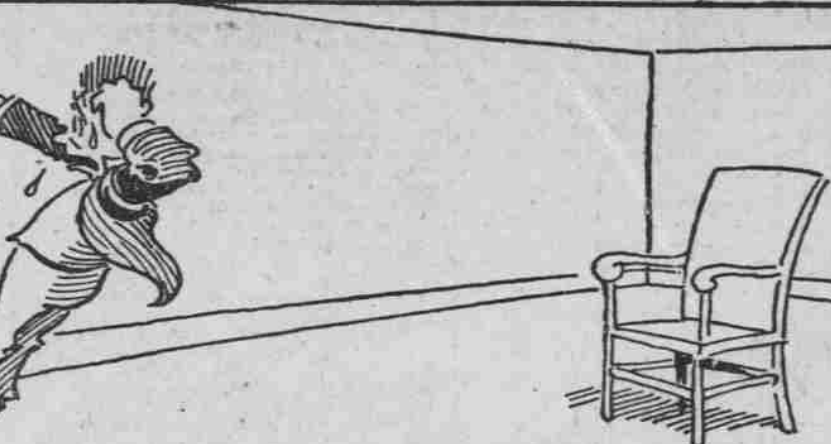
