T. T. KELLY FACTS

What the Second Findings of Commissioners Show.

Still Owes Miami County Over Four Hundred Dollars.

HE HAS PAID \$1,324.99.

This Brings Total Shortage to Over \$1,700.

Given Benefit of Every Doubt in Examination.

Detailed Supplemental Report of County Commissioners.

The additional findings of the county commissioners of Miami county holds that Thomas T. Kelly still owes Miami county \$412.01 on two fraudulent warrants, one for \$22.01 and the other for \$190. This is in addition to \$1,000 which he owes for a warrant against Kelly and returned to the county by him.

Another warrant was found which had been paid from Kelly's salary and the report finds that Miami county was defrauded out of \$100 by the raising of the warrant, but as the record does not show conclusively that Kelly got the money it is not charged against him.

The following is the report of the material findings of this last investigation, as given by the Miami Republican: A typewritten report, covering ten or twelve pages, being a portion of the findings of the county commissioners of Miami county, was made Tuesday, Oct. 14, 1902, by the county clerk, Reuben Smith, a member of the county board, was taken to the county clerk's office Tuesday night and was kept in a locked cabinet until Wednesday morning, when it was taken out and given to the county clerk, Reuben Smith, who is now in jail.

On the same date another warrant, No. 1065, was issued to the county clerk for the relief of the same named paupers for \$51.75, but there is no voucher on file and no record of its allowance. The stub of this warrant is not receipted.

April 14, 1901, W. J. Bound filed his voucher for \$10 for overhauling the poor. The back of the voucher, the commission on the bond, which is on file, shows that \$5 only was allowed. This amount was paid by warrant No. 1067 and was receipted for same date by W. J. Bound.

April 14, 1901, warrant No. 1096 was changed from \$100 to \$10.
