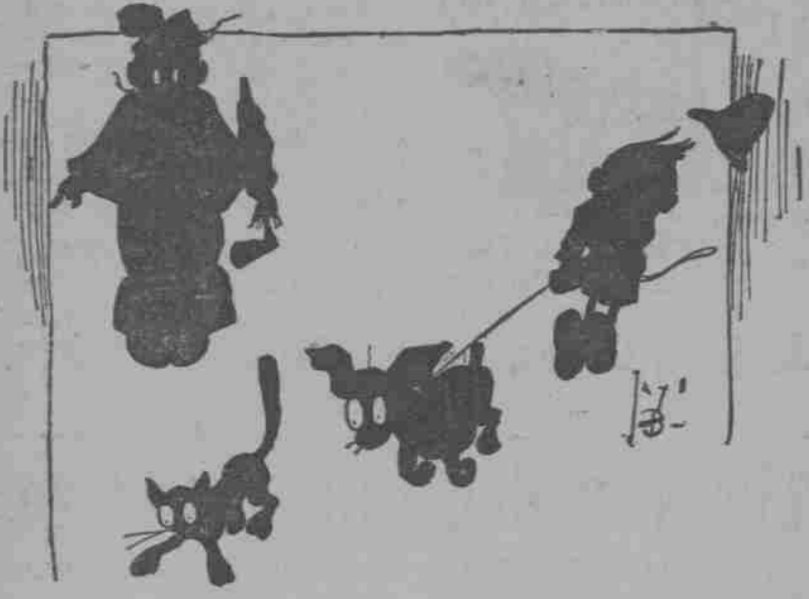

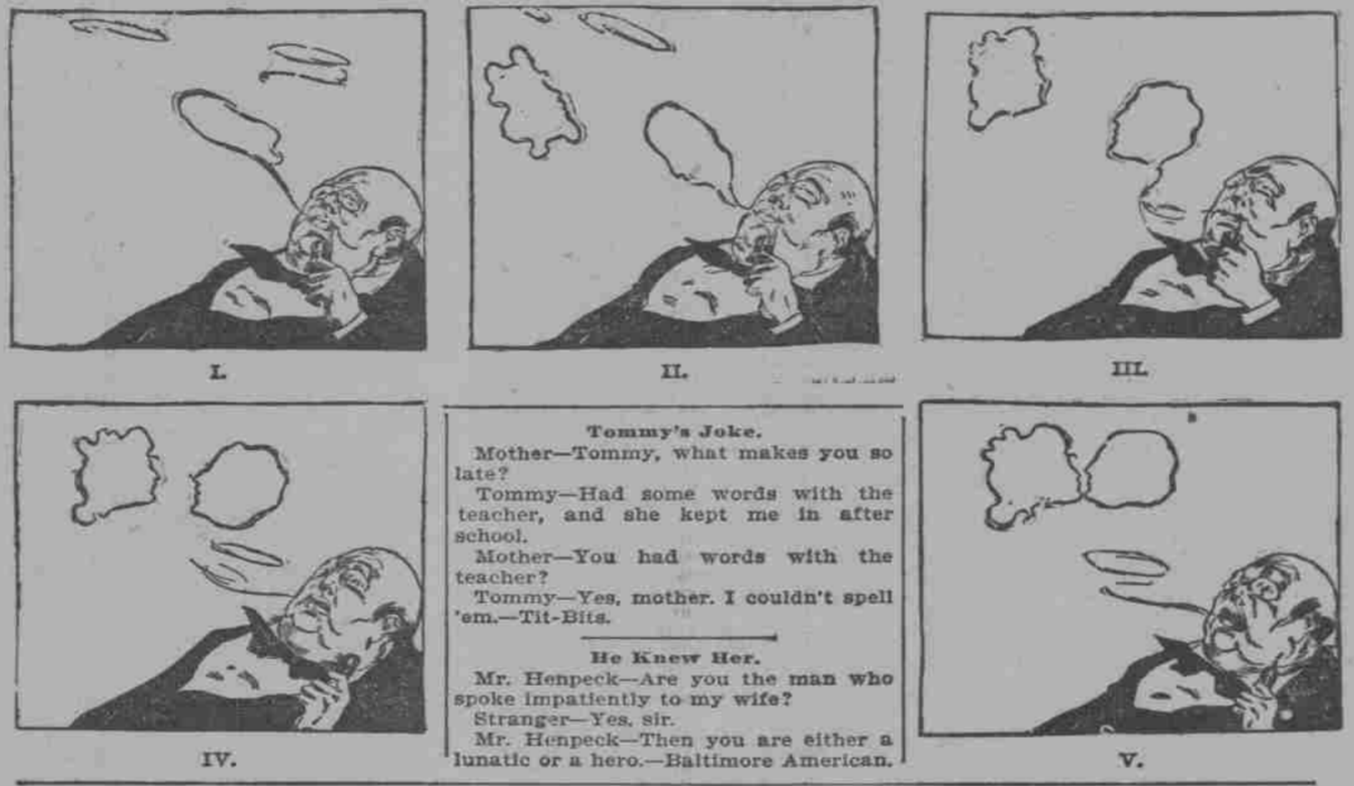

Tommy—Yes, mother. I couldn't spell 'em.—Tilt-Bits.

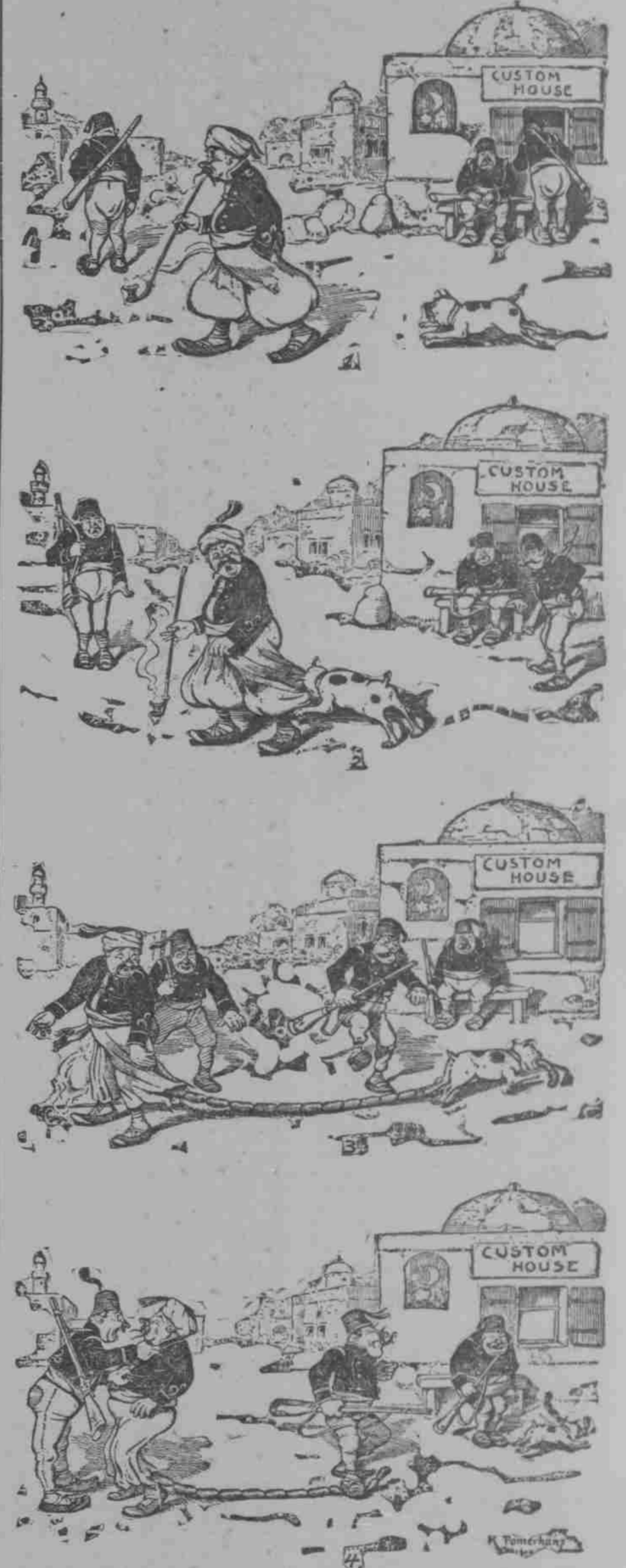
