

ELECTION FORECASTS FROM BOTH SIDES.

Republican and Democratic Politicians and Newspaper Correspondents Give Out Estimates.

Payne, Manley, New York Herald and New York Republican Headquarters, Say a Landslide For McKinley.

New York, Oct. 24.—Daily bulletins are being issued now from the various campaign headquarters as to the manner in which the electoral votes will be cast of the forty-five states in this union.

The Republican campaigners at the national headquarters have received a number of reports during the past week from all parts of the country in regard to the political situation, and as a result of them Senator Nathan B. Scott of West Virginia said yesterday that he had made up this table which showed about what the Republicans expect to get.

Manley's Figures. Joseph H. Manley, of the Republican national committee, is so sure now that Indiana is in the Republican column of states that he today gave out what will doubtless be his final forecast of the campaign. He figures that McKinley and Roosevelt will carry 28 states, giving the Republican ticket 251 votes, while the Democrats will carry 27 states, giving the Democratic ticket 203 votes.

THE NEXT CONGRESS. As to the complexion of congress, the Herald finds that the new house will have certainly 182 Republican votes, the Democrats 133, the fusionists and silver Republicans 4 and that in the senate Republicans 162, Democrats 7 fusionists and 4 seats are vacant.

At present the Republicans have 59 members of the senate. The Herald poll gives them 46 members next year, or one more than a majority. There are 40 doubtful senatorial elections pending. Among the indications cited by the Herald are that Quay in Pennsylvania and Elkins in West Virginia may be defeated.

DEMOCRATIC FORECAST.

How Stevenson Sees It. Adlai E. Stevenson made the fat-footed declaration that the Democrats would carry Indiana, and he added: "Ohio should be put down as very likely to give its electoral votes for Bryan. To my mind, the two great doubtful states which lean more strongly to the Democratic than to the Republican side in this fight are New York and Ohio."

McGuire's Prediction. Chairman McGuire today made a prediction at Democratic state headquarters that McKinley would come down to the Harlan river with 100,000 majority were erroneous.
