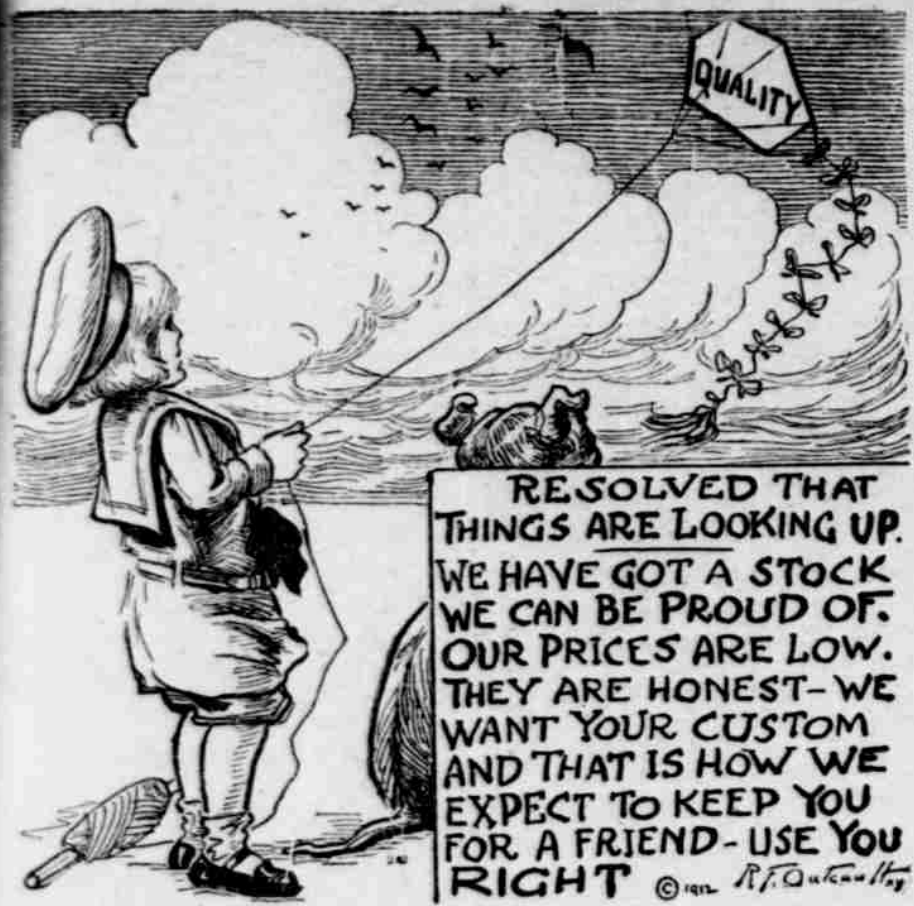

### Got The Towns Mixed.

Several weekly papers have gotten Nicholasville mixed up with some other town regarding the County Unit election. The election on this question was held in Jessamine county in 1912, and was overwhelmingly carried by the temperance forces. The case was appealed to the circuit court and Judge Benton sustained the election. On this ruling the wets appealed the case to the Court of Appeals, where it has been argued, but no decision has as yet been given. Two weeks ago a similar case was decided by the Court of Appeals from Barren county, and sustained, and it is almost certain that Jessamine's election will be declared legal.—Jessamine News.

## DEATHS

The Winchester Democrat contains the following death notice of a former Madisionian:

"After an illness dating back several months, Mr. John Tarlton Parrish, passed away at his home on East Broadway in this city, Thursday morning about eight o'clock. Deceased was in the fifty-sixth year of his age. He had been a resident of Clark county about sixteen years, coming here from Madison, where he was born and reared. He was a son of the late John G. Parrish, a native of Madison county, and one of the first settlers. He was a man, who by his unostentatious life, made few acquaintances, but one beloved by all for his integrity and true manhood. He was a firm believer in the equality of personal rights and supported the best men for office, no matter who it was, whether friend or foe. The record of his good deeds and actions will speak for themselves in years to come. One brother survives, Mr. W. O. Parrish, of this city, with whom he made his home. The funeral services will be conducted Saturday morning at the home on East Broadway, by Elder J. H. MacNeill, and the remains will be taken to Richmond for interment. Pall bearers will be Zena Bruce, J. Frank Lanter, Jerry Reeves, James Halley, John E. Lanter and Geo. Tracy."

Nathan Fain, aged 53 years, died at his home in Lexington, Sunday morning, of apoplexy. Mr. Fain was a native of Estill county and was twice married, his first wife being Miss Sallie Young, of this county. His remains were interred in Pleasant Hill burying ground in Jessamine county.

The many friends of Earl Bryson are mourning his untimely death, which occurred Wednesday afternoon. He was 14 years of age, a most cheerful and manly young fellow, and a favorite with all who knew him. It is thought that he was stricken with spinal meningitis. The remains were taken to Richmond, Friday, for interment.—Irvine Sun.

### Suffrage Bill Badly Defeated.

Woman suffrage received its death blow in the House Friday afternoon when the bill of Representative John G. Miller, Jr., of Paducah, that sought to give the woman of Kentucky the right to vote the same as men, was defeated by the vote of 51 to 29.
