The towboat Mary M. Michael comes off the dry dock tomorrow after being given a thorough overhauling. She will go into winter quarters here.  
This morning opened up bright and clear down about the river, but business on the levee was a little quiet. But good prospects for a lively day down about the water's edge tomorrow.  
The Ohio river is rising from Pittsburg to Louisville and falling from Evansville to Cairo. The Cumberland is rising slightly at Nashville. The Tennessee is falling from Chattanooga down. The Mississippi is falling from St. Louis to Memphis.  
The Ohio river at Evansville falling until Friday then stationary until Saturday. At Paducah and Cairo falling until Sunday, and the Mississippi immediately below St. Louis rising Friday. At Chester falling until Friday night and rising Saturday. At Memphis falling until next Tuesday or Wednesday.
