The Baldwin Locomotive Works are turning out for the L. & N. fifty-five consolidated freight engines, eleven ten-wheel passenger engines and five switch engines.

The Chesapeake and Ohio earned net in November \$518,308, being an increase of \$2,689. For the five months of the present fiscal year an increase in net earnings of \$851,297 is shown.
