1. Cultivate every available acre of land; don't let a field lay idle because you cannot attend to all the work yourself. There are plenty of persons who would be glad to get a job working.

2. Don't sell off everything you raise on your farm this year and then turn around this fall and pay some one else a profit on the goods that you placed on the market. Just sell your surplus.

3. Sell as much of your crop as you can on the hoof. This brings price per pound instead of price per bushel, and besides it leaves some of the fertility of your land instead of taking it away.

5. Don't sow poor seed of any kind. If you are in doubt don't sow that doubtful stuff. Good seed may cost, but it pays dividends to use it. And buy your seed from your home dealers.

6. Don't pin all your faith, work and energy to one crop. Make a specialty of one if you wish, but have something of another to fall back on in case of hard luck. You know you might need it.

7. Don't aim at quantity alone. Try to get the quality into everything that you raise this year. High quality will always bring a greater total than high quality of a poor quality.

8. Buying a dollar pocketbook to carry around fifty cents would be foolishness. So would be buying a thousand dollars worth of implements to harvest a five hundred dollar crop. Be economical.
