

Editor Roundabout:

Only a few days since there were three candidates for Representative of Franklin county-Mr. Julian, the regular Democratic nominee, Mr. Brawner, independent, and Mr. Lewis, the regular Republican nominee-But on Saturday last Mr. Lewis withdrew his name at a called meeting of the Republican County Committee, and now we have only two candidates.

Mr. Brawner's friends boldly proclaim that they caused Mr. Lewis' name to be withdrawn for the purpose of getting the near and Republican votes for Brawner, and thereby, if possible, defeat the regular Democratic nominee.
